shrubs that include bird of paradise, Indian hawthorn, Japanese pittosporum, gardenia, viburnum and liriope, and Cercis canadensis 'Forest Pansy' feature trees.

The strong lines and curves of the garden beds and walling complement the house and contrast the planting. "The rendered masonry walls have an acrylic finish that delivers a clean, durable surface and as the walls were used front and back, they maintain a unified look," explains Steve. "These walls are essential to this garden as they draw the eye around the space while acting as a key structural item that supports the deck and steps," he adds.

Decking was installed to extend the undercover entertaining area out into the garden and resolve the problem with the stormwater pits. "Due to a number of large stormwater pits we needed to maintain an unobstructed overland flow pathway, so a raised deck was the natural solution," says Steve. "We installed access traps into the deck to make maintenance easy.'

Acting as a visual connection between the rear and side garden, the deck also features built-in seating and a safe, dry external kennel for Diesel, the family dog. To complement the natural colour of the timber, Steve chose warmtoned Lichen tiles for the paved elements, resulting in a garden of great harmony.
